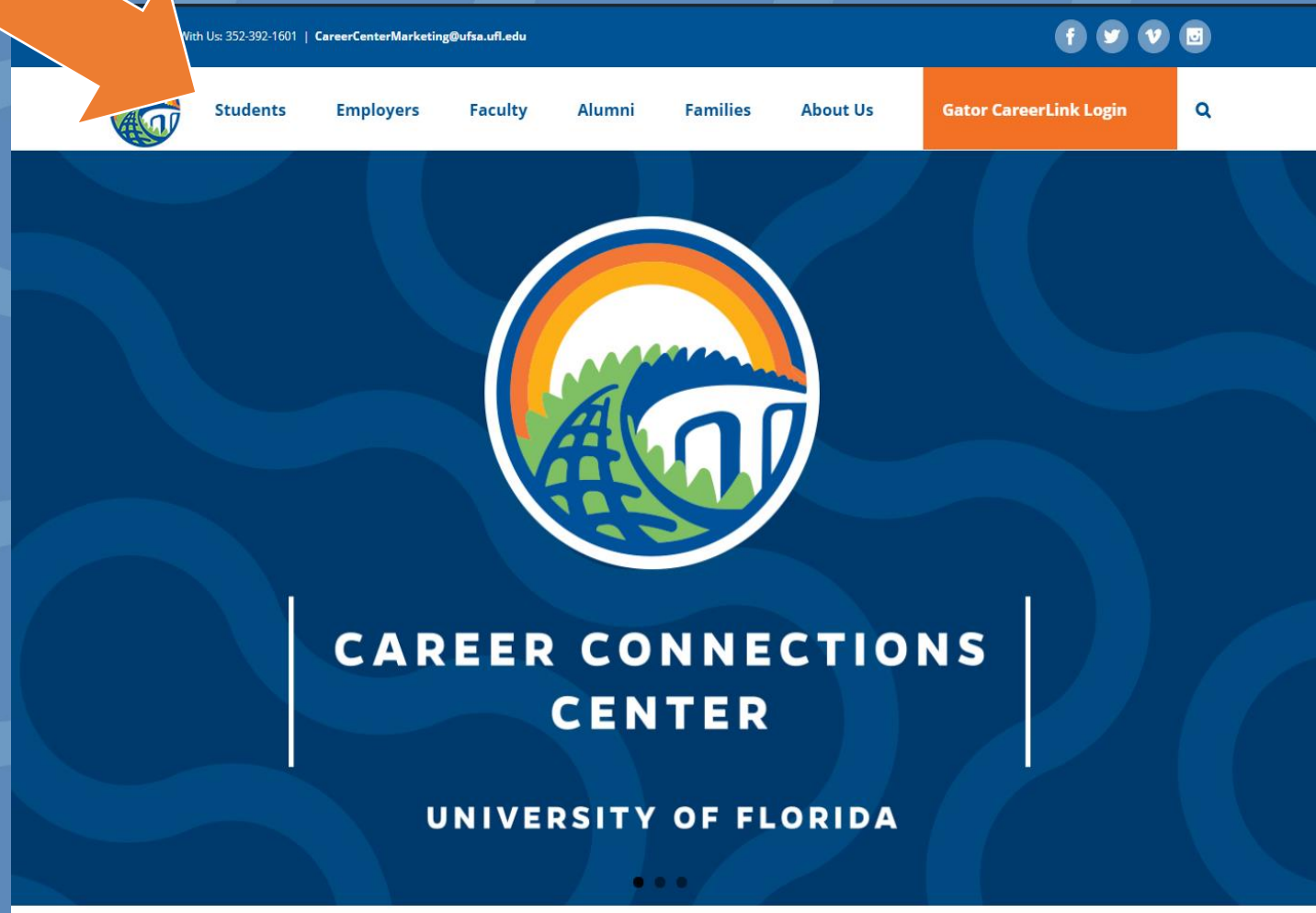


- **CHOMP helps you:**

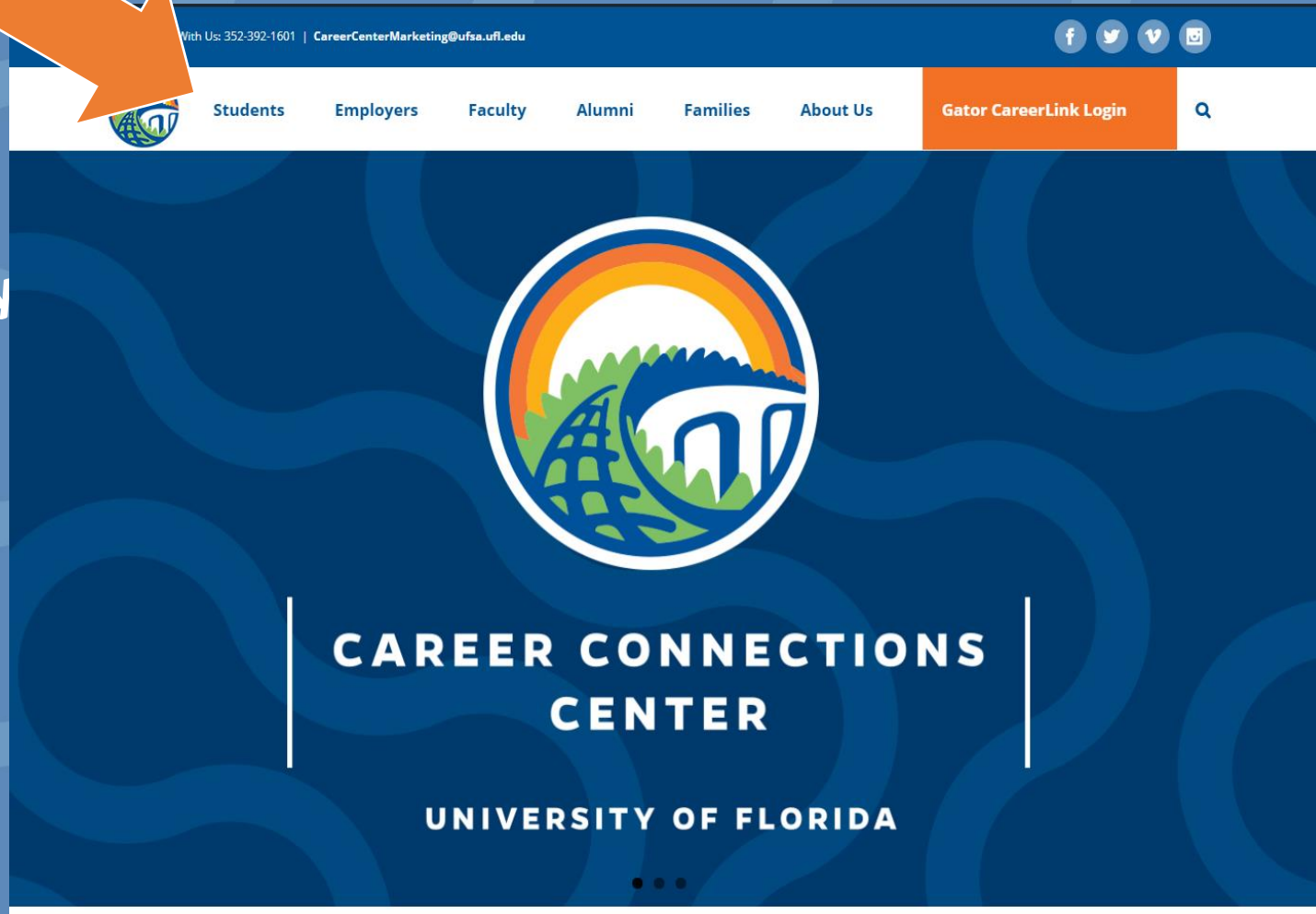

## Strategies

- Obtain essential practical experience through part-time or summer jobs such as camp counselor, tutor, or resident hall advisor.
- Complete an internship for academic credit.
- Gain experience through volunteering with organizations such as crisis hotlines, Big Brother or Sister, Special Olympics, service groups, etc.
- Many entry-level helping positions require one year of related experience. Volunteer experience and internships can typically fulfill this requirement.

## Find Occupations

### Keyword or O\*NET-SOC Code

Examples: 25-1011.00, dental assistant

Enter a word, phrase, or title to search for an O\*NET-SOC occupation.  
Enter a full or partial O\*NET-SOC code to look up occupations by code.

### Career Cluster

Career Clusters contain occupations in the same field of work that require similar skills. Students, parents, and educators can use Career Clusters to help focus education plans towards obtaining the necessary knowledge, competencies, and training for success in a particular career pathway.

### Industry

Industries are broad groups of businesses or organizations with similar activities, products, or services. Occupations are considered part of an industry based on their employment.

### Job Zone

Job Zones group occupations into one of five categories based on levels of education, experience, and training necessary to perform the occupation.

### Bright Outlook

Bright Outlook occupations are expected to grow rapidly in the next several years, or will have large numbers of job openings.

### Green Economy Sector

The green economy will cause a change in occupations' employment demand or work and worker requirements such as tasks, skills, knowledge, and credentials. Green occupations are linked to Green Economy Sectors.

### Job Family

Job Families are groups of occupations based upon work performed, skills, education, training, and credentials.

### STEM

Find occupations that require education in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) disciplines.





## Advanced Search

### Browse by O\*NET Data

O\*NET Data descriptors are categories of occupational information collected and available for O\*NET-SOC occupations. Each descriptor contains more specific elements with data ratings.

### Skills Search

Skills Search is designed to help you use your skill set to identify occupations for exploration. You select a set of skills from six broad groups of skills to create your customized skill list.

[What Human Resources Managers Do](#)

Human resources managers plan, direct, and coordinate the administrative functions of an organization. They oversee the recruiting, interviewing, and hiring of new staff; consult with top executives on strategic planning; and serve as a link between an organization's management and its employees.

[Work Environment](#)

Human resources managers are employed in nearly every industry. They work in offices, and most work full time during regular business hours. Some must travel to attend professional meetings or to recruit employees.

[How to Become a Human Resources Manager](#)

Candidates need a combination of education and several years of related work experience to become a human resources manager. Although a bachelor's degree is sufficient for most positions, some jobs require a master's degree. Candidates should have strong interpersonal skills.

[Pay](#)

The median annual wage for human resources managers was \$113,300 in May 2018.

[Job Outlook](#)

Employment of human resources managers is projected to grow 9 percent from 2016 to 2026, about as fast the average for all occupations. As new companies form and organizations expand their operations, they will need human resources managers to oversee and administer their programs and to ensure that firms adhere to changing and complex employment laws. Strong competition can be expected for most positions.
